












NORTHFIELD ACADEMY LOVES ART AND DESIGN


NORTHERN LIGHTS




investigating chemical reactions. We found out that a colour change can indicate that a chemical reaction has occurred. We mixed different chemicals together to see if they changed colour!







Northfield Pride Wednesdays @Lunch in room C13 ALL ARE WELCOME




